

## **Travelling To & From**

Airport Procedures - Be sure to check in for your flights about 12-24 hours prior to travel through the online app or website.

Country Procedures - Check with your destination travel requirements prior to arrival to be sure you'll have all necessary documents.

### **Getting Around**

Transfers - If this was arranged by my travel services, the transfer company take you from the airport to your hotel, locate your driver who most likely has your name on a sign near the designated pick-up area at the airport.

Rental Cars - If you rented a car for your trip, head to the car rental pick up area. For most destinations, during the time of your rental agreement, you'll obtain an international driving permit that licenses you to drive in that area.

Cabs - Cabs are a quick way to get around although rates can vary. You'll even find Uber and rentals scooters in some countries, too.

Rail - If rail is included in your package, your tickets will be included in your confirmation numbers. You will be provided with directions to obtaining your admission passes. If rail wasn't included in your package, you can hop on the rail by purchasing a ticket.

Buses - During your trip bus tickets may be a part of your self tour; if so, travel documents will guide you how to get on the bus. If bus tours aren't a part of your package but you have some free time to spare, you can hop on the bus by purchasing an admission pass by the day or by the ride. See nearby bus stop attendants for help!

Walking Around – Guided tours will usually require quite a bit of walking around your chosen destination. Look forward to walking on your own during any free time you may have.

## **Currency**

Cash - Currency types may vary destination to destination, so be sure to research what currency you'll need. before you go It's a great idea to exchange cash at your bank for a small US Embassy - For the official list of U.S. Embassy fee prior to your trip, rather than at the airport or in destination for a larger exchange fee.

Credit - Call your card company and banks before you travel to advise them of your travel dates and destinations. Some fees and restrictions may apply. Please note that sometimes you can use international ATMs for a fee.

Tipping – 10-15% is standard. Tips are appreciated in cash although not expected. You may find you can not tip when paying with a credit card.

#### **Communications**

Language – On this trip, your tour conductor will speak English. If you need anything repeated while travelling, just ask! Communication issues shouldn't be a problem.

Cell Phones – Be sure to let your cell phone provider know of your travels. International travel packages may need to be purchased for service.

## **Staying healthy**

Activities – Be prepared for the activities outlined in your tour itinerary. Listen to your body during times of high activity levels.

Hydration – Keeping yourself hydrated is crucial. While you may not feel the effects of the heat right away, dehydration can quickly catch up to you.

Be smart in the sun – Wear sunscreen and proper sun protection gear like hats and sunglasses.

# **Technology**

Internet – Some areas provide public Wi-Fi like in restaurants and hotels. Connections can be spotty in rural areas. Hotspots may not be provided outside of the US. Check with your providers.

Electricity – Bring along a converter adapter as suggested for your destination to plug in and charge your devices. No surge electric strips may be recommended in addition to the converter adapters. Use caution as selecting the wrong type of adapter could cause electrical fires or overheated devices. Charged-at-home power banks are also a great idea for charging on the go.

## **Emergencies**

Emergency Number - The emergency numbers for most of Europe are 112 or 999. Always check for destination-specific emergency numbers, but your travel documents may be the best reference for emergency phone numbes.
